PASTORAL FELLOWSHIP PROGRAM OVERVIEW

a. Program Philosophy

The Madison Avenue Baptist Church (MABC) Preaching Fellowship Program provides emerging ministers with an exceptional opportunity to cultivate their ministerial gifts within one of New York City's most historic and progressive faith communities. This two year fellowship combines practical ministry experience with intensive mentorship in preaching, storytelling, and worship as an art form—treating Sunday worship as a creative, theological exploration.

b. Program Overview

• **Duration**: Two years

• Commitment: 20-25 Hours/Week

• Start Date: Spring 2026, with flexibility to accommodate candidate needs and moving

arrangements

• Application Period: October - December 2025

c. Unique Mentorship Opportunity

Residents will work directly with Rev. Susan Sparks, whose unique background spans:

- Preaching Excellence: Nationally recognized speaker and preacher

FELLOWSHIP COMPENSATION AND APPLICATION PROCESS

Fellowship Compensation

- Base stipend: \$60,000-\$70,000 (Annually)
- **Healthcare allowance:**\$5,000 (Annually)
- Professional development fund: \$1,000 (Annually)
- Relocation Support One-time Reimbursement dependent on Candidate's location

Application Requirements

- Resume or CV naming MDiv, MTS, or equivalent graduation location and date, and ordination location and date or ordination timeline
- Cover letter, briefly answering these three questions:
 - Given that you'll be mentored by a pastor who is also a professional comedian and author, what aspects of your own personality, background, or life experiences would you bring to this unique learning environment? How would this unconventional mentorship shape your ministerial identity?
 - MABC treats Sunday worship as an "art form" and serves as a theological place for exploration. How would you contribute to creating worship experiences that engage both artists and seekers while maintaining theological depth?
 - MABC has a 177-year legacy of taking "great risks" for ministry (like rebuilding inside a hotel in 1929). If you could design one innovative ministry program or initiative during your fellowship that others might consider "risky" but could transform lives, what would it be and why?
- **Video submissions**: 2-3 compelling preaching/storytelling clips (2-3 minutes each, reel format acceptable)
- **Two professional references** (Optional in initial submission, required before we reach the Final Interview Stage)
